

What is a dual enrollment course?

A dual enrollment course allows a student to earn high school credit <u>AND</u> college credit simultaneously!

Our program is unique because we send Northeast State instructors to Daniel Boone High School to teach college-level courses.

In most cases, these courses are transferable to other colleges and universities. This means that your student is making progress on their college degree while they are still in high school!

Which dual enrollment courses are offered at Northeast State Gray in Fall 2024?

- Composition I @ Northeast State Gray (Fall Semester-SENIORS ONLY)-Mondays & Wednesdays 1st block/Tuesdays & Thursdays 1st block/Mondays & Wednesdays 2nd block—ALL SEMESTER
 - This is an introductory level English courses that most majors require.
- Public Speaking @ Northeast State Gray (Fall Semester-JUNIORS AND SENIORS)-Mondays & Wednesdays 1st block/Monday & Wednesdays 2nd block—ALL SEMESTER
 - ► This is a communications credit in college.



Which dual enrollment courses are offered <u>at</u> Daniel Boone HS in <u>Fall 2024</u>?

- Composition I and II @ Daniel Boone HS (Fall Semester-SENIORS ONLY)
 - These are introductory level English courses that most majors require.
- Introduction to Psychology and Intro. To Music @ Daniel Boone HS (Fall Semester-JUNIORS AND SENIORS)
 - Intro to. Psychology is a Social & Behavioral Science course, while Art History Survey II is a Humanities course. Most majors require at least 2 Social & Behavioral Science courses and at least 2 Humanities courses.
- General Biology I @ Daniel Boone High School (Fall Semester JUNIORS AND SENIORS)
 - This course meets a lab science requirement at the college level.

Which dual enrollment courses are offered at Northeast State Gray in **Spring 2025**?

- Composition II @ Northeast State Gray (Spring Semester-SENIORS ONLY)-Mondays & Wednesdays 1st block/Tuesdays & Thursdays 1st block/Mondays & Wednesdays 2nd block—ALL SEMESTER
 - This is an introductory level English courses that many majors require.
- Introductory Statistics @ Northeast State Gray (Spring Semester-JUNIORS AND SENIORS)-Mondays & Wednesdays 1st block/Monday & Wednesdays 2nd block—ALL SEMESTER
 - This is math course that many majors require.

Which dual enrollment courses are offered <u>at</u> Daniel Boone HS in <u>Spring 2025</u>?

- Modern U.S. History II and Introduction to Sociology @ Daniel Boone HS (Spring Semester-JUNIORS AND SENIORS)
 - Modern U.S. History II is a History course, while Introduction to Sociology is a Social & Behavioral Science course. Students must have at least 2 History courses and at least 2 Social & Behavioral Science Course.
- Introductory Statistics and Public Speaking @ Daniel Boone HS (Spring Semester-JUNIORS AND SENIORS)
 - Introductory Statistics is a math course. For many majors, this may be the only Math course that a student will need in college. Public Speaking is a Communication course. Most majors require at least 1 Communication course.
 - College and Lifelong Learning @ Daniel Boone HS and Northeast State Gray (Spring Semester-Juniors and Seniors)
 - College and Lifelong Learning is an introduction to college life; this class is required of nearly all majors at NESCC!
 - General Biology II @ Daniel Boone HS (Spring Semester JUNIORS AND SENIORS)
 - ► This course meets a lab science requirement at the college level.
 - Intro. To Education (Spring Semester -Seniors Only)
 - ► This is an upper level course in the Teaching as a Profession Program.

Additional <u>Spring 2025</u> Options <u>at</u> Daniel Boone High School

- Intro. To Plant Science
 - This is for students who have already taken Agriscience courses with Mr. Armentrout at Daniel Boone High School.
- Engineering Graphics
 - This is an introductory drafting course taught by Mr. Bishop.
- Intro. To Networking
 - This course is taught by Mr. Shipley.

What are the requirements to enroll in these courses?

- To enroll in Composition I, Introduction to Psychology, Intro. To Education, Modern U.S. History II, Introduction to Sociology, and Public Speaking, students must have an 18 in English and a 19 in Reading on the ACT <u>OR</u> have a 3.60 cumulative, un-weighted high school G.P.A. <u>OR</u> they must successfully pass the ACCUPLACER test.
 - The ACCUPLACER test will be administered at Northeast State over the summer.
- To enroll in Introductory Statistics, students must have a 19 in Reading and a 19 in Math on the ACT <u>OR</u> have a 3.60 cumulative, un-weighted high school G.P.A.<u>OR</u> they must successfully pass the ACCUPLACER test.
- To enroll in General Biology I, students must have an 18 in English, 19 in Reading, and 19 in Math on the ACT <u>OR</u> have a 3.60 cumulative, unweighted high school G.P.A. <u>OR</u> they must successfully pass the Accuplacer test.
- To enroll in College and Lifelong Learning, students must have a 19 in Reading on the ACT <u>OR</u> have a 3.60 cumulative, un-weighted high school G.P.A. <u>OR</u> they must successfully pass the ACCUPLACER test.
- The CTE courses taught at Daniel Boone HS require that students have previous high school CTE coursework in the subject area.

Career and **Technical** Education Dual Enrollment Course Information

- The options on the following slides will lead to a credential and do not require a minimum ACT or GPA to enroll.
- Students can also take classes in many of our programs within the Technologies division including Networking, Computer-Aided Drafting, and Entertainment Technology.
- Because these courses are taught at the Blountville campus, please discuss these options with your school counselor so that we can work together to create a schedule that works with your required high school classes, too!



Career Academies: 2024-2025

- Entrepreneurship Career Academy
 - 6 fully online courses (3 in Fall 2024 and 3 in Spring 2025)
- Welding Career Academy
 - Finalizing times now, but will be at Northeast State Blountville
- Entertainment Technology Career Academy
 - 2 days each week at Northeast State Blountville

Aviation Technology Jump Start

Students will have the opportunity to complete one semester (4 courses) of the A.A.S. Aviation Maintenance Technology program prior to high school graduation.

These courses will be taught on the Northeast State Blountville campus 5 days each week in the fall and spring semesters from 1:30 PM - 4:30 PM



Is there financial aid available for dual enrollment students?









Dual enrollment students who have <u>NEVER</u> taken dual enrollment courses before are eligible to receive grant funding to cover the cost of <u>5 dual enrollment courses</u> if they are TN residents!

Regardless of available grant funds, dual enrollment students are <u>ALWAYS</u> responsible for purchasing textbooks for their dual enrollment courses.

Students are eligible to receive \$100 per credit hour to put towards the cost of courses 6-10 if they maintain a 2.0 college G.P.A.

If your student has an out of pocket tuition cost, we can accept teacher and other state employee discounts for these classes. Students enrolled in CTE courses for courses 6-10 are eligible to utilize the Washington County Career Readiness Scholarship to assist with tuition gap fees.

What if my student enrolled in dual enrollment courses in 2023-2024?
