ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT GOALS

Washington County Goals:

- All students will have equal access to a safe learning environment that promotes academic achievement.
- Kindergarten Readiness focused awareness of children birth to 5.
- 80% of 3rd graders reading on grade level by 2021.
- The district will achieve a level 4 TVAAS score or higher in numeracy (mathematics).

School Goals:

- Communicate with my child's teacher by reading materials sent home, responding appropriately in a timely manner, and contacting the teacher or administrator as needs arise.

- Involve my child in home activities that foster improvement of reading and math skills including:
 - 20 minutes of reading every night.
 - Support my child in fluency of grade level appropriate math facts (adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing).

- Develop engagement activities through our Family/Community Involvement Plan, and PASS.

Our school follows the Tennessee State Curriculum for public schools and Tennessee State Standards.

Communication..

Grades K-1 use Daily Folders, Newsletters, 2-3 use Newsletters. All grade levels have a Classroom Dojo as well as access to a school wide Dojo and Remind101 used for general announcements and reminders.

As students we will...

- Make sure I attend school every day and arrive in my classroom prepared to learn by 8:00 a.m.
- I will do my best everyday. This means I will have high expectations for myself and approach all tasks with a positive attitude.
- Complete homework and classroom assignments on time.
- Treat all faculty and staff, parents, visitors, and school facilities with respect.
- Share school forms with my family and be responsible by returning forms to school in a timely manner.
- Read for 20 minutes every night.
- Practice my math skills, facts, and fluency every night.

- Meet annually with parents to discuss Title I requirements and funds.
- Be accessible to parents and respond in a timely manner between the school hours of 7:45 a.m. and 3:15 p.m. or after school hours through email or Remind 101 or Class Dojo.
